<p><b>Winter Stories</b></p> <p>Tell us about your favourite winter story! What is the title of the book? Who is the author? Can you draw a picture of the front cover?</p> 	<p><b>A Cold World</b></p> <p>Find out about a country or place that is cold most of the year round. Can you write a list of facts about this place?</p> 	<p><b>Keeping Warm</b></p> <p>Can you list 4 different ways you can stay warm in the winter? Why is it important to stay warm? What happens if you get too cold?</p> 
<p><b>Ice, Ice Baby!</b></p> <p>Make some ice in your freezer—how long does it take? Put the ice around your house with a grown up. Where does it melt the quickest? Why do you think that is?</p> 	<p><b>Signs of Winter</b></p> <p>Go for a walk in our local area, what signs of winter do you notice? Can you take photographs or draw them?</p> 	<p><b>Winter Creatures</b></p> <p>What animals do we see in winter? Can you find out how they manage to stay warm? Do we see these all year? Are there any animals who leave our country?</p> 
<p><b>Arctic Animals</b></p> <p>Research an animal that lives in the arctic or Antarctic. How do they stay warm? What do they eat?</p> 	<p><b>Warm in winter</b></p> <p>What foods might we want to keep warm? Can you make a meal with a grown up that might help you to stay warm in winter? Perhaps you could shop for the ingredients too!</p> 	<p><b>I write numbers to 10</b></p> <p>Can you practise writing your numbers from 1–10? How many can you write? Can you make some sets of objects and record how many you have?</p>
